## THE WEDDING BELLE

At precisely 10:15 am on Saturday 3<sup>rd</sup> October 1987, The Wedding Belle, a Preserved steam train owned by the Railway Preservation Society of Ireland will leave Central Station, Belfast for Bangor. The train, operated by an NIR crew, will be hauled by steam locomotive No.4 of the former LMS NCC Railway, built in Derby in 1947. The coaches, ranging in age from 1911 to 1950, have been restored by RPSI members, a Youth Employment Scheme and ACE workers, at the Society's headquarters at Whitehead. The restoration costs are enormous and the materials are paid for by funds raised by the membership and by fares from the enthusiast railtours and public excursions.

The Society has a membership of over 700 and runs the popular "Portrush Flyer" and "Steam Enterprise" trains each year to Portrush and Dublin respectively, as well as other shorter local trips.

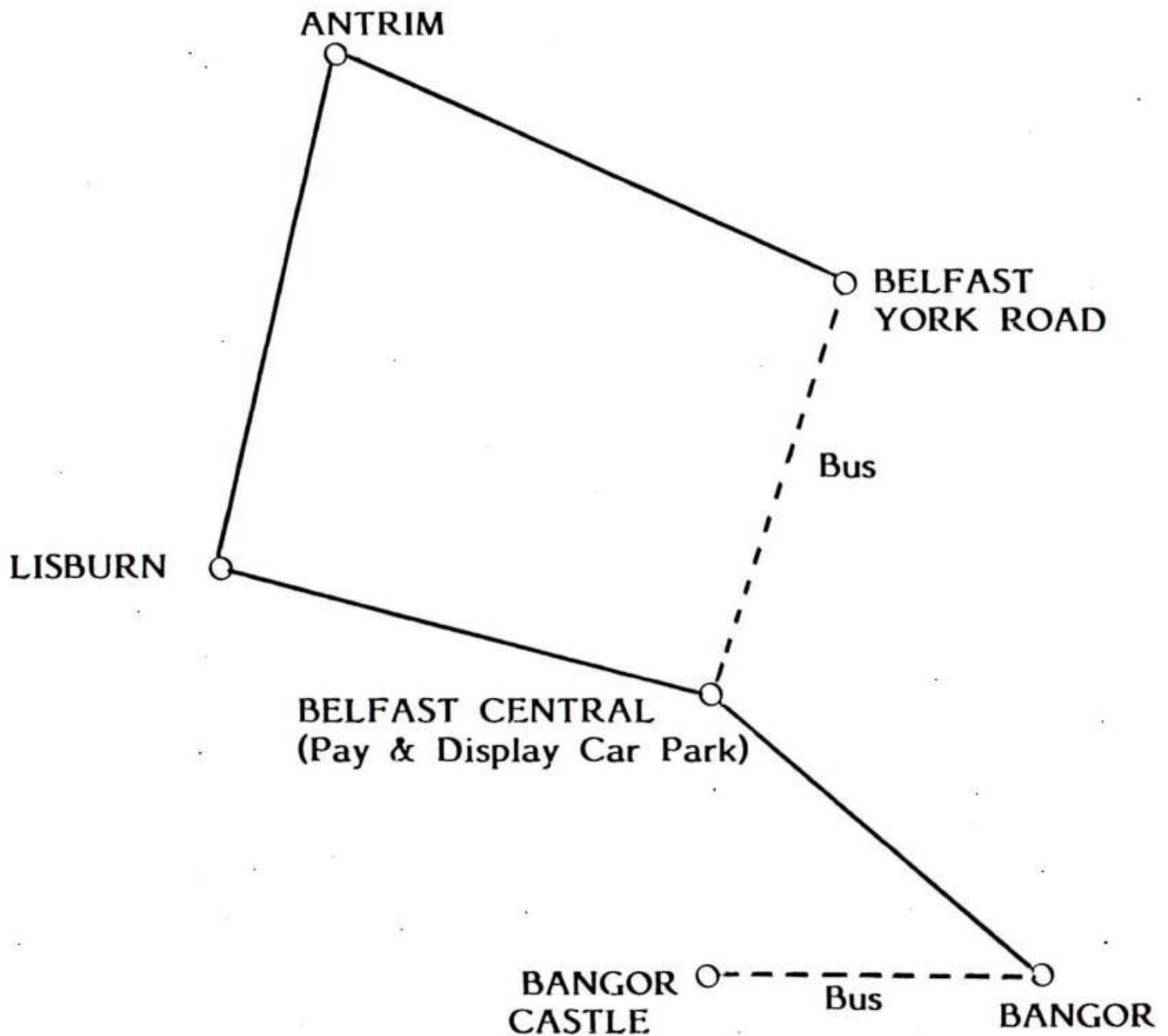
